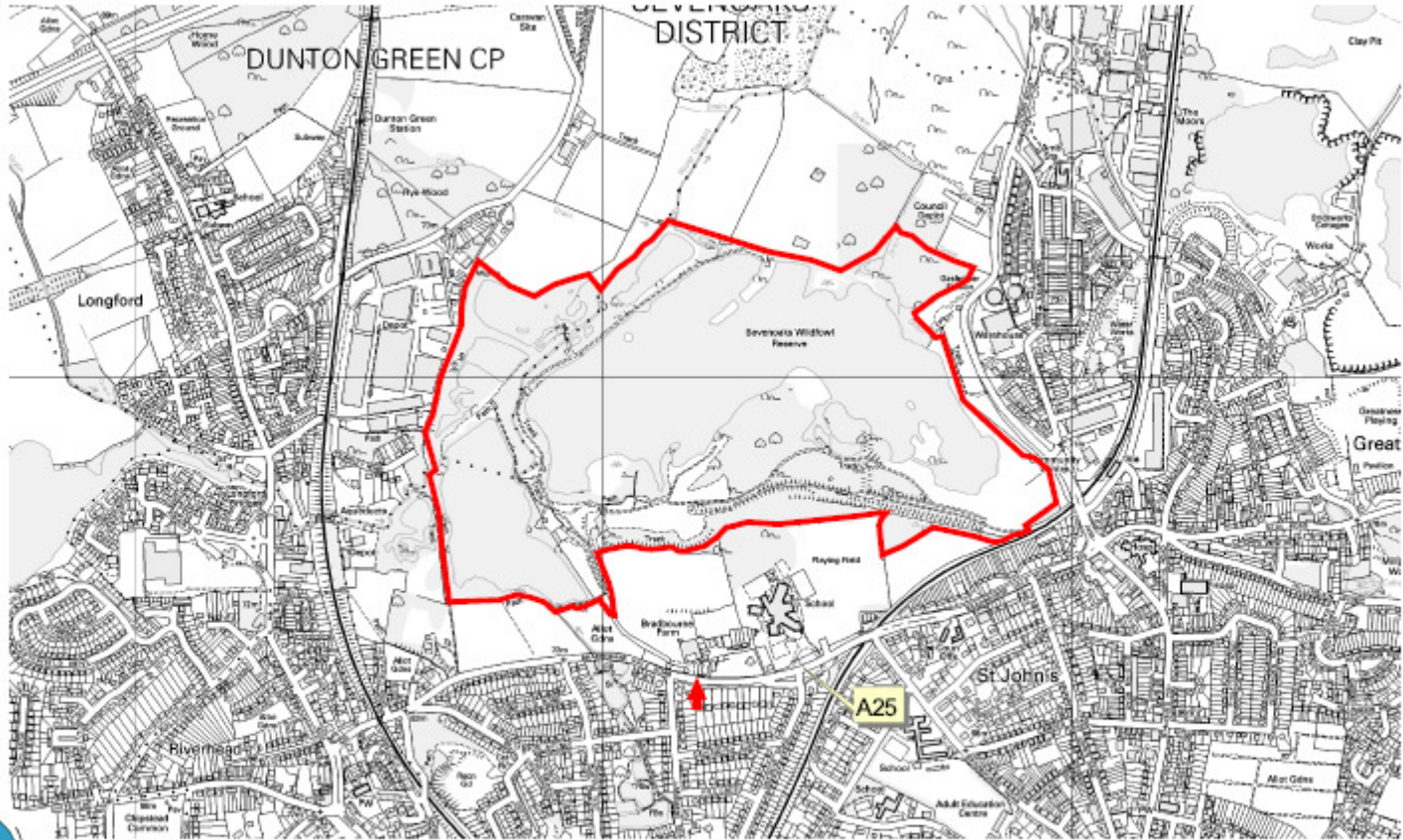

Who should attend			<p>This course is designed for those who wish to learn about woodland bryophytes and study some of the more easily identified species and their habitats.</p>				
Meeting place			<p>At the Jeffery Harrison Visitor Centre, Sevenoaks Wildlife Reserve, on the north side of the A25, Bradbourne Vale Road, between Riverhead and the Bat and Ball crossroads. Map Ref TQ 520565</p>				
Other sites to be visited			<p>Oldbury Hill , Car park in Styants Bottom Lane ,off the A25 TQ580559</p>				
Programme			<p>We will spend the morning in the classroom looking at specimens of woodland bryophytes and discussing their structures and habitats. We will spend the afternoon in the field at Oldbury Hill.</p>				
Subjects to be covered			<p>Brief look at structure and diversity of bryophytes and their habitats in woodland.</p>				
What to bring			<p>A 10 or 8x hand lens is essential (some will be available to purchase or on loan). Clothing and footwear suitable for the conditions of the day and a picnic lunch.
